General Regulations for Mudgee Show

1. Gate Entrances: (a) Exhibitors in Ring Events are to enter through the Madeira Road gate. (b) Sheep and Goat Exhibitors are to enter through the bottom gate on Douro Street. (c) Cattle Exhibitors are to enter through the gate near the corner of Douro Street and Nicholson Street. (CO Commercial Exhibitors and Dog Exhibitors are to enter through the main gate in Nicholson Street. (e) Members and members of the Public are able to enter through the middle gate on Douro Street or the Nicholson Street gate.
2. All Exhibitors must comply with the conditions of the section to which they have entered and to the extent that there may be any inconsistency between such conditions and these general regulations, then these regulations shall apply.
3. All exhibits during the show shall be under the control of the chief steward of the appropriate section who shall have the power to expel from the showground any person who in his or her opinion is interfering unnecessarily with any exhibit.
4. If in the opinion of a judge any exhibit in his or her section should be disqualified for any reason whatsoever he or she may pass the exhibit without comment but may report the matter to the chief steward of the section.
5. No person other than officials or competitors are to be allowed in the judging area during competition without the consent of the judge.
6. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous the society reserves the right of refusing admission to or removing the exhibit from the Showground at the expense of the exhibitor.
7. The society reserves the right to postpone the show or any event thereof at any time as a result of inclemency of weather or any other sufficient cause to a date or dates deemed to be suitable by the society and no entrance fees shall be refundable in the event of such postponement. The reasonableness of the cause or causes for postponement shall be determined by the society and such determination shall be conclusive.
8. The society may abandon the show or any event thereof as a result of inclemency of weather or any other sufficient cause and in such event exhibitors shall be entitled to the return of the entrance fees paid by them but the society shall not be liable to pay any damages or other form of compensation to any exhibitor by reason of the abandonment of the show. The reasonableness of the causes for the abandonment of the show shall be determined by the society and its determination shall be conclusive. Notwithstanding the time fixed for the collection of exhibits as sent out in the schedule, The society reserves the right to retain all or any exhibit for such further time as it may consider necessary and no exhibit shall be removed from the show without a formal permit from the chief steward of the section or the secretary of the society.
9. Any person interfering with an official or any exhibitor refusing in any way to carry out the instructions of any official may be, along with his or her exhibit or exhibits, disqualified from exhibiting at the show and may be removed from the showground at the discretion of the society.
10. An exhibitor who makes a false report or gives misleading information or suppresses necessary information respecting any exhibit may be disqualified and any prize money awarded to such exhibitor shall be forfeited.
11. The decision of a judge shall be final unless a protest against an award should be lodged in writing with the chief steward of the section within one (1) hour of the award being made or if the award is made before the commencement of the show, then within one (1) hour of the commencement of the show. The protest must state the reason for the protest and must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 to be forfeited if the protest is unsuccessful. The protest will be determined as soon as practicable by a protest committee appointed by the society and the protest committee's decision shall be final.
12. In the event of there being only one exhibit in any class the awarding of a prize will be left to the discretion of the judge.
13. Prize money will be paid in accordance with the awards entered in the award book and signed by the judge and shall be payable at the show except in cases where protests are entered. All prize money not claimed before April 1 next following the show will be forfeited to the Mudgee Show Society.
14. Any person entering the showground during the duration of the show shall comply with all proper directions of any official of the society and in particular without affecting the generality shall comply with such directions as to the driving and parking of motor vehicles and bicycles and the riding of any horse or other animal within the showground.

Conditions of Entry for Mudgee Show

1. Mudgee Show Society Inc. (The Society) reserves the right to refuse any application or to cancel any entry, without being required to give any reason.
2. Applications will not be accepted unless accompanied by the appropriate entrance fee.
3. The Exhibitor shall abide by the conditions of the section(s) to which he or she has entered, and the General Regulations for Mudgee Show as set out in the schedule. The Exhibitor acknowledges that he or she has had the opportunity to inspect the schedule by arrangement with the Secretary of the Society before making this application.
4. The Exhibitor warrants that the exhibit(s) entered for competition is/are and will remain the property of the Exhibitor whilst the exhibit(s) is/are in the possession of the Society.
5. The Exhibitor acknowledges that the exhibit(s) is/are accepted and held by the Society at the risk of the Exhibitor and the Exhibitor releases the Society, its officer, members, servants and agents, from any claims, demands, actions, suits, judgements, and accounts whatsoever in respect of any injury, loss or damage occasioned to any exhibit arising out of any act or omission of the Society, its officers, members, servants, or agents, or any member of the public whilst the exhibit is in the possession of the Society and whether or not such injury loss or damage is caused or contributed to by the negligence of the Society, its officers, members, servants or agents.
6. The Exhibitor hereby indemnifies and agrees to keep indemnified, the Society, its officers, members, servants and agents, from and against all claims, demands, actions, suits, proceedings, judgements and accounts, whatsoever, for any injury, loss or damage to any person or property occasioned by or arising out of the operation or use of any exhibit entered by the Exhibitor or occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission by the Exhibitor.
7. The Exhibitor acknowledges that these conditions of entry may be pleaded as a bar to any claim, demand, action, suit or proceeding, that may be brought by the Exhibitor against the Society or any officer, member, servant or agent.
8. Where the application is made by a person under the age of eighteen (18) years or under any other legal incapacity, The parent or guardian who signs this application, in consideration of the Society accepting the application at his or her request, indemnifies and agrees to keep indemnified, the Society, its officers, members, servants and agents from and against, all claims, demands, actions, suits, proceedings, judgements and accounts whatsoever, whether brought or recovered by any person (including the Exhibitor) or corporation in respect of any injury, loss or damage to any person or property (including any exhibit) occasioned by or arising out of the operation or use of any exhibit entered by the Exhibitor or occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission by the Exhibitor or whilst the exhibit is in the possession of the Society and whether or not such injury, loss or damage, was in any way caused or contributed to by the negligence of the Society, its officers, members, servants or agents.

1. All trucks/livestock vehicles to be parked away from the livestock area prior to 8am Saturday morning. Vehicles will be towed if they remain in the area.
2. Sheep must be penned by 9am Saturday, for judging to commence at 9.30am.
3. Sheep from local exhibitors are to stay until 5pm Saturday.
4. All sheep exhibited must be bred by the exhibitor and have a registered earmark.
5. All sheep are to be Regulation 19 shorn.
6. Brucellosis – All sheep shall come from accredited free flocks. The Accreditation Certificate must be shown if requested.
7. Footrot – All sheep shall come from accredited free flocks or owner declaration free flocks. Certificates are to be shown if requested.
8. Ovine Johnne's Disease – Sheep must be from flocks not under suspicion of OJD AND From flocks MN1 or better; Certificate number OR From MN1 equivalent tested flocks within the last 12 months (Veterinary Certificate to be shown) OR From a flock with a negative check test within the last 12 months (Veterinary Certificate to be shown).
9. All sheep from the Residual Zone must be from flocks with MN1 status or better OR From flocks with a negative equivalent test in the last 12 months.

2. All sheep must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor. Sheep entered in milk teeth only classes must also be bred by the exhibitor.
3. All sheep must be registered with, and according to the rules of, the relevant societies.
4. Sheep in shorn classes to be evenly shorn & not carry more than 4cm in Border Leicester classes and not more than 2cm in Short Wool classes.
5. Limit of two sheep per exhibitor per class, school entries with a maximum of four.
6. Sheep entered in the pair of 2 are not to be drawn from any other general classes; however, sheep entered in the groups are to come from general classes.
7. "Any Other Breed" applies for any individual registered breed not shown.
8. Brucellosis – All sheep must come from accredited free flocks. A photocopy of Accreditation Certificate MUST be given to the Chief Steward.
9. Footrot – All sheep shall come from accredited free flocks or owner declaration free flocks. Certificate must be shown if requested.
10. Ovine Johnes Disease – Sheep must be from flocks not under suspicion of OJD.

NATIONAL SHEEP HEALTH DECLARATION - EXPLANATORY NOTES

Overview

Completing this National Sheep Health Declaration (NSHD) will assist prospective buyers to make an informed decision about the health status and management history of these sheep. The NSHD is mandatory for all sheep movements in SA and for sheep being moved into NSW and Tasmania. It is voluntary in other states.

Livestock Production Assurance (1)

Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) program accreditation means that a property must have a biosecurity plan for the property. The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual for Grazing Livestock Production can be used to develop plans or further information [including templates is available at: www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/epidemic-disease/farm-biosecurity-plan](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/epidemic-disease/farm-biosecurity-plan)

Footrot (3 and 4)

3. Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on this and interstate movements of sheep, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.

4. If answered Yes, all mobs should have been checked during at least one spread period, and any lameness investigated, with no symptoms of the disease observed. If answered no, producers can add any information about the disease and their management of it; e.g. whether any testing has been carried out, or what treatments may have been used recently.

Lice (5)

All mobs should be checked for lice at least twice each year. Any sheep seen with rubbed fleece or pulled wool should be checked for lice as a matter of urgency. Further information is available at: www.paraboss.com.au

Approved Vaccinate (7)

A sheep that is identified by an NLLS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:

- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, OR
- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
 - was in the SheepMAP, or
 - had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
 - had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.

SheepMAP (8)

An audited quality assurance program incorporating a property biosecurity plan, animal health risk assessment, testing, and movement controls that provide a source of low risk animals. Note - the level of testing varies depending on the status. Date of last test should be recorded in Q9.

Types of tests that may be recorded (9)

Faecal 350: A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or High Throughput Johnes (HT-J) PCR in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 500: At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 150: At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

JD management practices (10)

Any other management practices carried out for JD could be recorded here; e.g. types of introductions to the flock, or veterinary investigations.

Other relevant health information (11)

Any other information that a producer thinks may be relevant can be recorded here; e.g. participation in an active grower group, One Biosecurity, or other biosecurity initiatives, mulesing status, pain relief usage, etc.

Declaration

Signing this declaration has legal significance under fair trading and other relevant state legislation. Regulatory authorities may also take legal action, and purchasers may seek damages for any information that is incorrect. Before signing you must be satisfied you understand all elements of the document, and these explanatory notes.

 4. **Infected but undertaking an approved Property Disease Management Plan:** An infected herd that has not yet progressed to RD1 status but is complying with an on-farm disease control program combining elements of testing, kid rearing and biosecurity that has been approved by CVO of the jurisdiction.
 5. **Infected or suspected of being infected:** Means infected or suspected of being infected with JD. Herds are no longer regarded as infected or suspected of being infected when a Property Disease Management Plan, which has been approved by the CVO of the jurisdiction, has been completed.
 6. **Check Test:** A test of 50 homebred goats over 12 months of age in the herd (or all goats over 12 months of age in smaller herds) by serology or faecal culture or pooled faecal culture of 2 pools each of 25 goats, with negative results. The animals should be selected so as to increase the probability of detecting infection, i.e. older animals, animals in poor body condition.
 7. **Approved Vaccinated Goat:** A goat that is:
 - Vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age; or
 - Vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks, when the flock owes in the GoatMAP, or
 - had undertaken a negative Sample Test by PFC in the 2 years preceding the vaccination; or
 8. Dis identified as an Approved Vaccinate in accordance with State legislation.
 8. **Nationally approved kid rearing plan:** A kid rearing plan designed to minimise the spread of JD in intensively managed herds, which has been documented and agreed by GICA and Animal Health Committee.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer.

Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at:

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTIONS 3 & 4: BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA VIRUS (PESTIVIRUS) TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Dairy cattle may be tested through bulk milk testing. Contact your veterinarian for assistance. Producers who don't know the answer to these questions should tick the 'N' box.

QUESTION 5: JOHNE'S DISEASE TESTING

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.

TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments in the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.
